ONLINE COFFEE HOUR – We tried on online coffee hour the last two Sundays on the Zoom app. Though it went well the first Sunday, interest wasn’t there last week. We have alternate plans today, anyway.

WEEKLY FOOD MINISTRY – As an aid to those who may be struggling, Deacon Jim has stepped forward to lead a weekly serving of our parish Food Ministry. Every Wednesday at 5pm, a brown bag meal is brought to the car of those visiting us in the parish parking lot – no questions asked. We served 109 people during the month of April, our highest-volume month in many years. A need is being met!

MENS SPIRITUAL RETREAT – The YMSofR Men’s Spiritual Retreat will be taking place, but in an adjusted format. It will be a digital experience, with different virtual offerings on Facebook Live, YouTube, and the Zoom app. More information will be forthcoming, with how to sign up to attend this retreat. It is open to all men.

MEMORIAL DAY SERVICES – Are currently scheduled to take place as (close-to) normal on Monday, May 25 at the Sacred Heart of Jesus Cemetery on W. 54th Street. We will ask anyone who may be attending to continue to observe policies of social distancing.

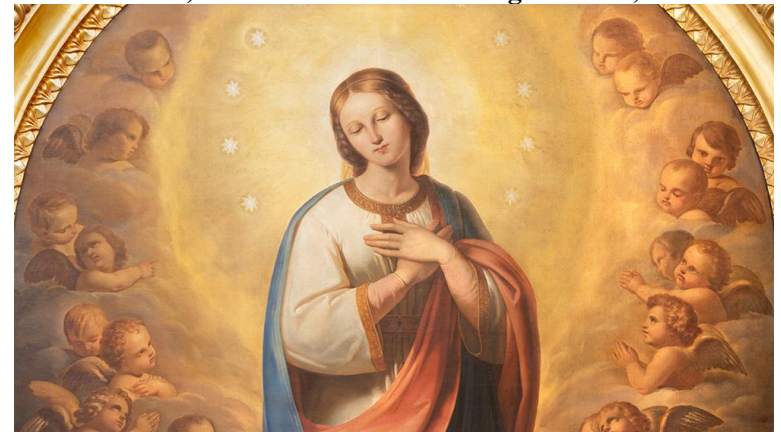

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

THE FIRST LESSON *the Acts of the Apostles (6:1-7)*

As the number of disciples continued to grow, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit, also Philip, Prochurus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicholas of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

THE SECOND LESSON *the first letter of St. Peter*
(2: 4-9)

Beloved: Come to him, a living stone, rejected by human
beings but chosen and precious in the sight of God, and,
like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual
house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices
acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it says in
Scripture: ‘Behold, I am laying a stone in Zion, a
cornerstone, chosen and precious, and whoever believes in
it shall not be put to shame.’ Therefore, its value is for you
who have faith, but for those without faith: ‘The stone that
the builders rejected has become the cornerstone, a stone
that will make people stumble, and a rock that will make
them fall.’ They stumble by disobeying the word, as is
their destiny. You are “a chosen race, a royal priesthood,
a holy nation, a people of his own, so that you may
announce the praises” of him who called you out of
darkness into his wonderful light.

the Father’? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and
the Father is in me? The words that I speak to you I do not
speak on my own. The Father who dwells in me is doing
his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the
Father is in me, or else, believe because of the works
themselves. Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes

in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father.”
