WORSHIP AT ST. MARY'S– Today is the “soft” re-opening of St. Mary's for public worship. For the next number of weeks, public worship will be relegated to one Mass on Sunday morning at 9am. The clergy will continue to provide online worship on other days. We will also be recording Mass live on Sundays, so please be aware of the cameraman. There are a number of restrictions in place in order to worship in person. In order to be allowed into church, a mask is a must – and we extend from there. Please be open to being escorted to a pew that might not be “yours”, as well as being patient in exiting church. Communion is available from the clergy after Holy Mass or by appointment. All of our information for participating in worship has been made available prior to Sunday Holy Mass.

ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION – This prayer is to be used when you are unable to receive the Sacrament and desire to do so: *Most loving Jesus, I adore You in the Most Blessed Sacrament, in Which You are truly present. I love You above all things and I long for You in my soul. Since I cannot receive You sacramentally, I ask You to come spiritually into my heart and heal my soul. I embrace You and unite myself with You; may I never be separated from You. In flame my heart with the fire of Your love, my Lord and Savior. Amen.*

MAY DEVOTIONS – Marian Devotions will continue to be offered at St. Mary’s near our normal time and day. Each Wednesday during the Month of May, we will offer The Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, along with a hymn or two, honoring the patroness of our parish. On May 6 & 20, it will be in Polish, while on May 13 & 27, it will be in English. Services will be livestreamed on Facebook at 6pm and then uploaded to YouTube by 7pm. We hope you enjoy our offerings of this devotion.

WEEKLY FOOD MINISTRY – As an aid to those who may be struggling, Deacon Jim has stepped forward to lead a weekly serving of our parish Food Ministry. Every Wednesday at 5pm, a brown bag meal is brought to the car of those visiting us in the parish parking lot – no questions asked. Last week, over 40 were served – the highest weekly tab yet – great things happening!

MENS SPIRITUAL RETREAT – The YMSofR Men’s Spiritual Retreat will be taking place June 18-20, but in an adjusted format. It will be a digital experience, with different virtual offerings on Facebook Live, YouTube, and the Zoom app. It is the hope that a number of our men will take advantage of this format this year.

MEMORIAL DAY SERVICES – Are currently scheduled to take place as (close-to) normal on Monday, May 25 at the Sacred Heart of Jesus Cemetery on W. 54th Street. We will ask anyone who may be attending

to continue to observe policies of social distancing. Please bring your own chair, if desired, and plan on parking outside of the cemetery property, as the tremendous amounts of rain have left the ground over-saturated. The graves of those who served in the armed forces will be blessed by the clergy if it is dry enough; if not, within the next weeks.

But let no one among you be made to suffer as a murderer, a thief, an evildoer, or as an intriguer. But whoever is made to suffer as a Christian should not be ashamed but glorify God because of the name.

Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come. Give glory to your son, so that your son may glorify you, just as you gave him authority over all people, so that your son may give eternal life to all you gave him. Now this is eternal life, that they should know you, the only true God, and the one whom you sent, Jesus Christ. I glorified you on earth by accomplishing the work that you gave me to do. Now glorify me, Father, with you, with the glory that I had with you before the world began. "I revealed your name to

those whom you gave me out of the world. They belonged to you, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you gave me is from you, because the words you gave to me I have given to them, and they accepted them and truly understood that I came from you, and they have believed that you sent me. I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for the ones you have given me, because they are yours, and everything of mine is yours and everything of yours is mine, and I have been glorified in them.
