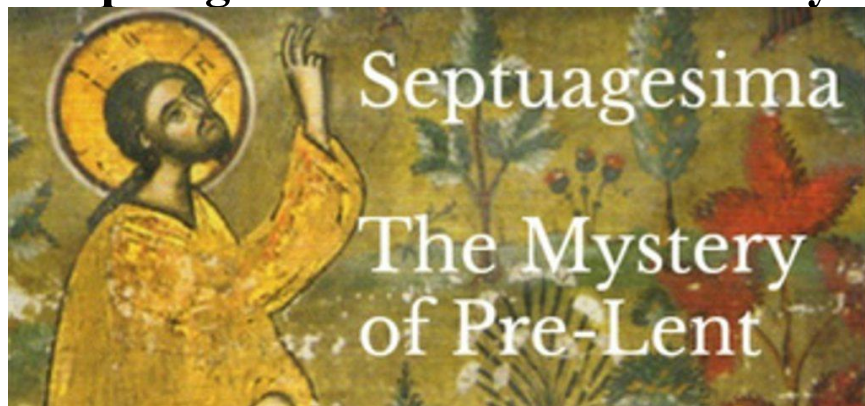

***Announcements***

**PRE-LENT** – Pre-Lent is a Christian observance of devotion that was in preparation for the fasting and atonement of the Lenten Season. It allowed some to begin their fast even earlier. In this period, flowers are

traditionally removed from the sanctuary, as is the Gloria and the alleluia verse.. Thematically, it really is in between the “green” of Jesus’s ministry and the “violet” of penance. The rose-colored vestments show that thematic bridge. For those following in prayer and scripture life, the Sunday readings for Pre-Lent are taken from Ordinary A 6, 7, & 8.

**CANON** –Today, and for the month of February, we use the 2<sup>nd</sup> Eucharistic Prayer on p. 82, the Canon of St. Hippolytus.

**POINSETTIAS** –Christmas decorations have been removed in time for Pre-Lent. As some of our flowers are still pretty healthy, we invite you to take poinsettias home with you– many of them are in tremendous shape and have a lot of life in them yet! And why poinsettias? The vast majority come from Mexico, known as “floras de noche buena.”, or “Flowers of the Holy Night. The shape is akin to the Bethlehem star, the red color represents the blood Christ would shed, and the white the purity belonging to the sinless Christ Child.

**VOTING MEMBERS** – As we approach our Annual Meeting (rescheduled for Sunday, February 8<sup>th</sup>- keep an eye for emailed reports[and let Fr. Jason know if you do not receive his emails]), we offer a reminder that although anyone could attend the meeting, one must be a “voting member” in order to vote in voice, ballot, etc. A voting member of a Polish National Catholic Parish is defined in Article III of the PNCC Constitution as one who is over 18, believes in the Faith of the church, participates spiritually (attending and receiving Sacraments at least once a year) and materially to the parish.

**SAVE THE DATE** – Saturday, March 7, from 10am-2pm, the Lenten Retreat of the Northeast Seniorate of the Western Diocese takes place at St. Mary’s. Usually this is in the Toledo area, but it was voted to take place here. A sign-up sheet will be made shortly to begin planning for this event – open and encouraged for all parishioners & friends.

**ADORATION** –On Friday, February 6, a Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament will once again take place (First done Jan. 9<sup>th</sup>). This one, beside the prayers to expose and reserve the sacrament, will be silent, but printed materials will be provided for the faithful. Please consider offering time before the Sacrament-this will be taking place monthly in 2026 and at different times of day (next time during Lenten Retreat)

**SUPERBOWL SQUARES** – The Super Bowl takes place on Sunday, Feb. 8- a repeat of the immensely satisfying, epic, and wonderfully-resulted 2015 iteration, the Seattle Seahawks and the NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS. Add some excitement by purchasing squares 2 for \$5- see Mark Avondet after Mass. May the (Patriots) best team win!

**CHRISTMAS CONCLUDES** – The 40 day celebration concludes tomorrow at 9am Holy Mass with “Candlemas”, Solemnity of the Presentation. Candles are blessed for distribution to all, or you may bring your favorite candle to church for a blessing. As the clock turned Midnight, Christmas began with candles in the hands of the faithful– it concludes with the same message, of light overcoming darkness, long after the world has moved on. Worship with us and hear Christmas Carols for the last time until the day after Halloween!
