By desiring to exercise more, eat healthier (ie, less fatty meats/ whatever), and to live a more structured life, we are doing our darnedest to improve that physical

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exterior for all to see.

When put that way, it kinda sorta sounds a bit selfish, doesn't it? Who are we seeking to gratify in this—God, or our own self-image and worth?

As loaded as I just wrote it out to be, it really isn't an "either/or" situation. First Corinthians 6:19 says "Don't you know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God, and that you are not your own?"

St. Paul teaches us in this sixth
Chapter of his 1st Letter to the

God in body and spirit. If a resolution is made within those parameters of Lent, if they are

take on the visage of something
greater, something spiritual.

Achieving improvement in the face of temptations like fast food commercials and 50% pizza sales? Great! It may seem trivial in the face of Christ's temptations...but an accomplishment is an accomplishment.




call this time of approaching spring a time of rebirth, salvation. But above all this is a time to straighten out one's affairs with God, the Creator, the Judge, and Destiny."

## Recipe Watch: Lenten Vegetarian Mole Chili

This newsletter was once renowned for its ventures into the
culinary sphere. Here is a recipe
for a pot of meatless chili that
you can serve any day of the
week during the Lenten Season.
It also can (and has been) used
by a certain priest to appease
his meatless-for-Lent wife.

#### The Recipe:

1 large diced onion, 1 medium zucchini, sliced and quartered, 6 stalks celery, diced, 1 diced green pepper, one diced yellow pepper, 4 cloves of garlic, smashed.

Cook down in a large pot with 1 tablespoon olive oil for about 5 minutes. Add 1 tablespoon of cumin, 1 tablespoon of unsweetened cocoa (makes it "mole, pronounced moe-lay), and 2 tablespoons of chili powder and cook until veggies are softened.

Add 3 cans of tomatoes—diced are preferred as well as 3 or four cans of drained and rinsed beans (depending how beany you like it). Vary your beanspinto, red/white kidney, black, etc.

Then add 1 1/2 cups sugar, another tablespoon of cocoa and chili powder, and cumin, salt, pepper, honey, garlic powder, etc. to taste. Bring to a boil, and bring to low for an hour or so.

Vegetarian chili doesn't take an entire day! Top with diced onions and cheese and voila!

Prime Bishop Hodur heeded the call of his people to begin the PNCC in March of 1897 and led the church until his death in 1953.
