MIDNIGHT MASS OF THE SHEPHERDS – PASTERKA

December 25

Prior to the beginning of Mass, assistants will come up to the edge of each aisle, bringing the lit flame to the candles you were handed upon your arrival. This is the Light of Christ, which will symbolically be brought from the Congregation to the Christ Candle on the altar. Please, everyone leave your candles lit until after the Christ Candle has been lighted.



PROCESSION TO MANGER – “Sliczna Panienska”

LIGHTING OF THE CHRIST CANDLE

The celebrant, together with his assistants approach the crèche. The statue of the infant Christ is placed within the manger.

C: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

R: Who made heaven and earth.

C: Lord hear our prayer. **R: And let our cry come to you.**

C: The Lord be with you. **R: And also with you.**

C: Let Us Pray...Almighty God, Who on that wondrous night sent forth Your salvation, manifested in the person of Your Son, Jesus Christ, look upon Your faithful people gathered in Your church, commemorating the Nativity of our Lord in the stable in Bethlehem. Grant, we ask You, that the Savior of the World might be born again in the hearts and souls of all people. To You we sing and give praise, honor, and glory; and we ask You to instill in us godliness and holy love; strengthen our faith and grant us Your true peace – that peace which we can only find in You. We ask this through the same Jesus Christ, Our Lord. **R. AMEN.**

The celebrant then blesses the crèche with Holy Water and then with incense.

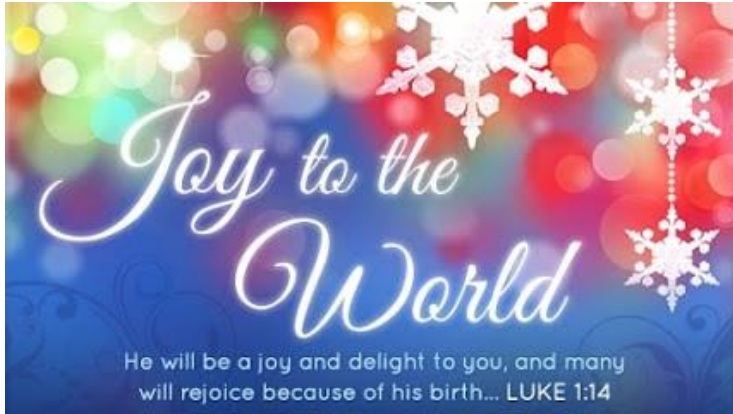

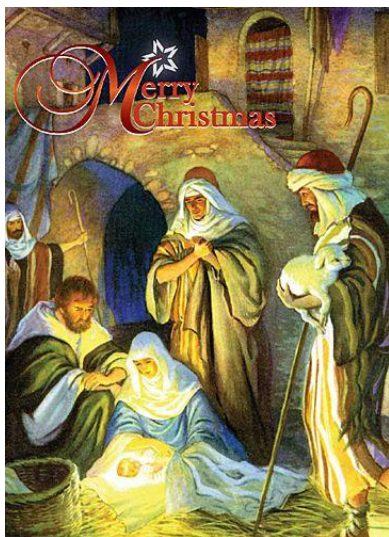
