St. Mary's hosts Western Diocesan Mass of Chrism

Each year in Catholic Dioceses across the world, priests flock to their bishop, the chief shepherd of the diocese, to con-celebrate the annual Mass of Chrism each Holy Tuesday. This Mass, originally designated for the morning of Holy Thursday in dioceses that are more geographically easy-to-traverse in, now takes place Tuesday of Holy Week.

In the Polish National Catholic Church, the bishop of each diocese makes the decision where the Mass of Chrism is to be held. Traditionally, it would held in the Cathedral of each diocese. This way, the bishop, who travels often, is allowed to remain closer to home. The Cathedral structures are usually larger and accommodating a sanctuary full of con-celebrating priests is usually a bit easier there.

The PNCC's Western Diocese, to which St. Mary's belongs, has seen the Mass of Chrism travel through the years. In this last decade, if it hasn't been held at



our Cathedral in Chicago, it has been held at parishes in Hamtramck, MI; South Chicago, IL; Cedar Lake, IN; South Bend, IN; and now, Parma, OH. At the behest of the bishop, this allows parishioners from each parish to experience this unique Mass on an occasional basis.

As our Western Diocese is still without a bishop, we were blessed to have the Prime Bishop of the Polish National

Catholic Church, his grace the Most Rev. Anthony Mikovsky travel to Northeast Ohio for this Mass. While our diocese is

ably served by our diocesan administrator, the Very Rev. Charles Zawistowski (St.

Mass on this Holy Tuesday, April 15, began with procession into the



Church, where the thurifer preceded the crucifer, followed by the rest of the altar party. Prime Bishop, who served as chief celebrant and homilist, was the final clergy in procession, appropriately vested in miter and carrying his crosier. Upon entering the sanctuary, his miter and crosier were removed and Holy Mass began, with Deacon Douglas Scott (All Saints; Chicago, IL) assisting him at Mass. Parishioners Barb Bogzevitz (1st & 2nd Reading) and Marzena Krulik (Responsorial Psalm & Alleluia) served as lectors.

Besides the blessing of oils, this Mass also celebrates

the Institution of the Priesthood – in fact, as the Prime Bishop finished imparting the Sacrament of the Word of God by his homily, he turned to

the priests in the sanctuary and offered a general renewal of commitment to priestly service. He then turned to the faithful and noted them as witnesses to hold the priests accountable in said ministry.

Mass continued, and the concelebrants, the priests of the diocese, encircled Prime Bishop for the beginning of the Canon of the Mass (the Eucharistic Prayer). Then, right before the Minor Elevation, Prime Bishop descended to the prepared table of oils and offered his blessing on the "OI" (oleum infirmorum), Oil of the Sick or Oil of the Infirmed. This oil is used specifically in the Sacrament of Anointing (of the sick).

Once the priests and Prime Bishop received Communion together, the faithful received as well. The sacrament was reserved, the sacred vessels were abluted (cleaned), and then Prime Bishop descended to the table of blessing

again. First, he blessed the balsam, which would be added to the oil to make the "SC" (*sanctum chrisma*) or Sacred Chrism. He then breathed 3 crosses upon it, which each diocesan priest individually approached and repeated. St. Hippolytus of the 3rd century referred to this oil as the "oil of thanksgiving", used to anoint the crown of the head of one baptized, at confirmation, to create baptismal water, or





to consecrate a bishop, altar, chalice, paten or bells.


Still gathered around the table of oils, the Prime Bishop then blessed the "OS" (oleum sanctum, also known as "OC" oleum catechumenorum) or Oil of Catechumens. His blessing was accompanied by a singular breath, as the diocesan priests also offered from their

> standing area. The oil of catechumens has been used for baptism, exorcism, ordination of priests, anointing of kings and for baptismal water.

Prime Bishop ascended the altar and Mass concluded shortly, with his episcopal blessing and the dismissal offered by the deacon. Fr. Jason Soltysiak, (St. Mary's; Parma, OH) offered a few closing

words and introduced each clergyman who was in attendance. Besides those already mentioned, those in attendance as concelebrants were: Very Rev. Charles Zawistowski (Administrator of the Western

Diocese), Very Rev. Jaroslaw Nowak (Administrative Senior; Northeast Seniorate), Rev. Greg Gronn (retired), Rev. Henryk Galas (Our Savior; Dearborn Hts, MI), Rev. Jose Rojas (San Juan Bautista; Chicago, IL), Rev. Nazario Salas (SS Cyril & Methodius; Chicago, IL) and Rev. Mariusz Zochowski (St. Hedwig; Chicago, IL). MC's, or Masters of Ceremony of the liturgy were Very Rev. John Kowalczyk (Administrative Senior; Central Seniorate), Rev. David Rowinski (All Saints; Chicago, IL) and Rev. Jim Ploskonka (All Saints; Sterling Hts, MI). The clergy processed out of church after the final hymn, returning to take a few pictures

before returning to un-vest from Holy Mass.

A dinner was served shortly after the Mass of Chrism, with pots of soup homemade by parishioners of St. Mary's accompanied by home-baked bread and some bakery breads as well. Desserts delicately awaited each diner at the table so they did not have to get up again once they retrieved his or her desired main course.

St. Mary's was proud to serve as host of the Diocesan Mass of Chrism for the very first time. Thank you to our Prime Bishop for traveling to be with us and serving as celebrant. Many thanks to the parishioners who excitedly prepared to host this unique event; from cook-

ing to purchasing to prepping to decorating to welcoming to worshipping to singing to dining and to cleaning.

As we were prompted before our celebration of Mass: "May the blessing of these Holy Oils remind us of Christ's love for us, shown in visible signs. May it also remind us that all of us have a share in Christ's work, as we care for the sick, love our children, and try to bring them and others to know and love our Lord. May we, who are strengthened by these Holy Oils guide and prepare others for a life of loving and serving the Lord as the holy people of God, members of the Church."

Holy Triduum and Easter 2025

The Lenten Season gloriously culminates with the Holy Triduum and Easter each year. While St. Mary's was proud to host the Western Diocesan Mass of Chrism, everything this holy season indeed crescendos with the Triduum and Easter Sunday.

Maundy Thursday brought about the official reception of the Holy Oils blessed by the Prime Bishop & the clergy of the diocese just days prior. Holy Mass is quite eventful, as it features the "belled" Gloria, where every bell in church is rang until the conclusion of the Gloria—it is at its conclusion that bells are silenced until

the Easter morning call of "Come Rejoice the Lord is Risen".

Holy Mass continued a capella as well as solemnly. The Mandatum was heeded in the washing of feet and after Communion was distributed, the reserved Body of Christ was reposed to the side altar, signifying Christ's arrest and being taken away from his disciples. The altars were then stripped at the recitation of psalms.

Good Friday worship began with the Liturgy of the Pre-Sanctified at 11am. This is the main service of Good Friday, and the only one required by the Church as part of the Holy Triduum. The Passion according to John is proclaimed, the Cross of Veneration is revealed, Intercessions are read and the liturgy of the Pre -Sanctified is held, with Communion consecrated at the previous night's Maundy Thursday's

Mass distributed to the faithful under one species, the Body of Christ.

The 3pm Service featured the Stations of the Cross and the symbolic entombment of the crucified Christ, coinciding with the final Station.

Tenebrae was celebrated at 7pm, with Bill Zychowski and Fr. Jason leading the chant as Fr. Greg, Nicholas, and Chuck led the liturgy.

Holy Saturday featured a noontime Blessing of Easter Food and the 3pm Easter Vigil Liturgy. There, new fire, the Paschal Candle, Holy Water, and Baptismal Water were

blessed as the faithful also renewed the vows made at baptism. The Litany of Saints was chanted and then Easter Food was blessed once again.

Easter Sunday Resurrection Mass began joyfully at 7am with the unveiling of the empty tomb and the procession to the four corners. The choir sang beautifully, their selections well-prepared and rehearsed during Lent. The altar servers served reverently and accurately. The faithful were, simply, happy to be celebrating our Lord's Resurrection! Procession concluded with the re-staging of the 3 symbols of the Resurrection: the statue of the Resurrected Christ, the Paschal Candle, and the cross of the Eter-





nal Priesthood.
