

On Monday, September 14 at 2pm, Bishop-Elect Jaroslaw Rafalko was consecrated to the episcopacy of the Polish National Catholic Church. Prime Bishop Anthony Mikovsky served as Consecrator, while Bishop John Mack and Bishop Paul Sobiechowski served as the official "co-consecrators."

What an event! With some adjusting on-the-fly, the adjusted drive-thru PolishFest 2020 went off without a hitch...well, maybe a couple hitches!

The first sign of what was to come was that our little ad on Facebook went viral, to the tune of over 200,000 impressions! Our original plans for food were upgraded....and upgraded again. It became very difficult to plan.

With a 4pm start time set for September 4, it became obvious something was up, as cars lined up beyond the surrounding streets over an hour before start. Sales had to be halted at 6pm, an hour before the scheduled time, with the last meal served hours later. In total, 693 dinners & 43 kielbasa sandwiches were served on our first day, which was great...but it depleted our stock, making us postpone our second day for a few weeks.

Western Diocese Clergy Conference & Retreat

The need for clergy to come together in conference and retreat is abounding. There is a often a loneliness to ministry, as much of the work in the vineyard of our Lord is done by oneself, with the Holy Spirit in tow!

The Clergy Conference & Retreat of the Western Diocese took place September 21-23 at Cardinal Stritch Retreat Center in Mundelein, IL. Most of the conference and the entirety of the retreat were available on the video conferencing Zoom app.

The event began one week to the day after our Diocesan Bishop's holy consecration to the 3rd of the Major Holy Orders, the episco-

pate. Bishop Rafalko was ready to lead this conference in a new way, having done so as the elected Chair of the Clergy Conference for the last number of years.

The conference and retreat consist of a balance of liturgical worship, prayer, retreat, meeting, conferencing, and social time.


A penitential service was offered, as was Holy Mass each morning. The conference allowed for the election of Very Rev. Charles Zawistowski as the new chairman of the clergy conference.



Fr. Jason led the retreat portion remotely via the Zoom App. He led a virtual "tour" of the Polish National Catholic Church, which included 3 stops at parishes of each American Diocese, for a total of 12. Scripture, prayer, and a ministerial reflection were offered at each stop.

Plans are already in place to hold next year's function at the same facility, perhaps with some chance for remote attendance as well.

The response by our Food Ministry Committee has strengthened over the course of the Covid-19 pandemic.

With Deacon Jim's leadership, meals have been served by the crew (Patti D., Patty B., Kenny P., Mak Mak P., George B.) and a neighbor has worked to continue to help us provide our community with "day-old" Panera Bread samplings—bread, bagels, and desserts...for free!

After averaging between 55-70 monthly meals pre-pandemic, the following has been served, by month,

as we've gone weekly:

April: 109, May: 131, June: 161, July: 207, August: 235, Septem-

ber 292!
