Picking up Sand...

This past weekend, I got to take my son to the beach for the first time (Huntington Beach). It was wonderful, the crowd was only growing as we were leaving, social distancing was easy, and it will be





one of those "forever memories" that a dad has about his kid.

Although Brady had a blast in the water and laughed hysterically when a larger wave would splash on him while I was holding him, I kind of day dreamed as he was later playing in the sand and was brought back to the struggles of the last 4 months of parish life. Every handful of sand that was earmarked for the pail next to him had about half that landed not in the pail, but right next to it.

The last article I wrote for this newsletter was on the Lenten Fast, as we were gearing up for the "meat" of the Lenten Season. At that point, I had heard of the Corona Virus, it seemed to have trickled into the United States...and by the time the Newsletter was printed, there was no one in church to pick it up.

So it began—I had sleep-deprived nights and anxious days as I prayed to figure out....what to do next? Beside the inherent danger and the scary numbers and projections, I was worried about a parish that, not a couple

months prior, noted a wonderful increase in Sunday attendance.

We (with the "we" being the support crew for whatever plans I was coming to) decided to go almost exclusively video. And man, we hammered the video thing. My goal was to put out at least 4 videos a week, with many weeks having a video every day.

Sunday Mass was broadcast every week—not one was missed. As the PNCC provided guidelines, we brought in a "choir of two". Weekday Masses were broadcast too, bringing Fr. Greg Gronn on board to do a bi-weekly Mass for Health.

It was Lent, so there was a ton to do— Stations of the Cross, Bitter Lamentations...and then...Holy

Week. I was never so stressed in my life over Holy Week! Each service was broadcast whole or in part. With the response from the digital community, it really felt as if the worshipping world was focused constantly on the Cross.

Easter was awesome, in that it felt spectacular to celebrate....something. I had a lump in my throat as Mass began, knowing the many that wished they were worshipping their Savior in their familiar church.

Then there was a drop-off.

Numbers, of course, aren't everything in ministry, but they ARE a thing. When everything is digital, they become much more prevalent. After Easter, our viewership cratered...no sand in the bucket. Though I am fully aware that many other parishes were finally getting in on the digital thing, it still felt...bad. It felt like Easter was the finish line for

digital ministry, and not just a waypoint.

It meant that it was time to be more creative, and luckily, many were ready. More videos: other para-liturgicals, an Easter Hymn series, a Cello series of music, a long video series on vestments.

As Covid-19 updates became the hottest original programming (was it, Wine with DeWine?), it looked as if Ohio was a leader in Covid response. We would start to open soon?

Now, the creativity had to bridge the virtual versus real gap. A take-out dinner, a pierogi sale. Give-aways on Mother's Day and Father's Day. "Secret emails" that went out to parishioners to honor a girl who lost her high school graduation and a guy who won a major battle against cancer.

Once the weather warmed up and we got detailed instructions how to welcome worshippers

back in-house, it was more head-scratching, debating, and planning. At the same time, our viewership dropped again—being digital-only was losing it's proverbial fastball.

And at the same time, my older brother went home to be with his Lord. It was a trip that included painful



social distancing from my brothers and parents, the sight of my once-mighty big bro reduced to something much less, and, as I've mentioned at Mass: the inability to hug my own mother when that was almost all that was appropriate to do.

Our soft re-opening took place in our parking lot, with a wonderful crowd in attendance. It led to another lump-in-the-throat moment for me, as it was Mass in front of real live people—I was preaching to a dot on the back of a cell phone for months!

Now, we are battling a bit uphill again, as some of our parishioners enjoy the wider expanse of an outdoor Mass....some only feel it appropriate to worship in Church.

Simply, may we be prayerful in the decision making process...and that this terrible, deadly, annoying, God-forsaken, inconvenient, world-stopping virus will have a vaccine...and soon!

MASS SCHEDULE



Paul understood the sacrifices that had to be made for the sake of the Gospel and he willingly made them. Have you ever been called to sacrifice something as a disciple of Jesus?


How can you prepare this month to be able to give up things of the world for the sake of the Eternal Kingdom of God?

How can you, as a disciple, help others take their relationship with our Lord more seriously?




Prayer for Independence Day


Let us pray.

How should a church respond to a pandemic? If there is one thing that was fleshed out over the last few months, it is the fact that...well, there is no clear answer to that question.

Deacon Jim Ploskonka, who heads our monthly Food Ministry program, contacted Fr. Jason with that question. His decision, supported by help from his brother and others, was to actually *increase* our food ministry program.

He thought (correctly) that there was

a different need that our parish had the ability to meet within our community. He decided to go on a weekly basis—a Wednesday evening brown bag meal served every week.

Using the greatest precautions, people warmed up to the weekly idea.

We plan to feed the hungry in our (still weekly) Ministry, delivered right to cars/people in our parish parking lot. Our plan is to continue weekly



throughout July and August. As a nice feather in the cap of St. Mary's Parish, we have surpassed 8000 meals served since this ministry's inception some nine years ago! Surely, God is smiling upon the selfless work of our small parish.
