Turning Back the Clock



One of the joys of having a young child is when he begins to hit milestones that you yourself remember.

Although I have some hazy memories of pre-school, kindergarten was pretty vivid—I can recall my room, teacher, who I sat with, things we learned, my first punishment (something rhymed with "art" that I boldly proclaimed, inspired by my older brother), and my first days of dreading going to school.

While my memories are enhanced by the fact my elementary school was across the street from my home (Prospect Street School was built alongside Holy Saviour PNCC in Union City, CT), I now get to re-see kindergarten through my own child's eyes.

Of course, same as those who have walked this path with kids or grand-



kids— they are now learning stuff I remember learning much later on!

With all of that said, my eyes are always drawn to the Advent Wreath at the beginning of Advent, with the countdown to Christmas. Though Christmas can never be as magical as it was through our innocent child-aged eyes, re-living it with one of your own is the closest we can hope for!

Anticipation is excitement, waiting eagerly for something you *know* is going to happen. I have always thought the most genuine example of this is sitting at a restaurant. The restaurant was chosen for a reason; the drinks have been brought to the table, and you have placed your order for something that you are *really* looking forward to eating.

And every time the door to the kitchen opens or the waiter/waitress walks by, you look with all sorts of longing that he

or she will be carrying your piping-hot food! Though...sometimes we look while pretending *not* to look, right?

That anticipation lasts for maybe 10, 20, 30 minutes, depending on the restaurant and the company you may be keeping. But it is true, right? And when that order finally arrives, that way-too-large feeling of "ahhh" washes over you, whether you are a sixyear old and it is chicken tenders & fries or sixty and it is a sizzling steak and mashed potatoes!

Anticipation, even for that hour setting, is what makes paying-up for the restaurant experience "work".

In our humble parish of St. Mary's, we offer a number of parish adjustments to make Advent "work" to help our worshippers prepare for Christ.

Blue Vestments—explained to represent prophecy and anticipation. Not a unique tradition, but one that isn't part of all Catholic Advent traditions.

Advent Wreath— the 4 Sunday countdown, each roughly representing a

millennium that God's people awaited a savior.

Penitential Service— a time to recollect and spend a bit more time on preparing and cleansing our souls in a season whose history was once much more penitential in nature.

Retreat— the clergy provided a series of presentations for the congregation to become more intimate with all things Advent, all in the name of full preparation for the coming(s) of Christ.

Of course, we all do our own "things" and traditions at home to prepare. Every family has a date or weekend that they usually put up the tree or lights; this builds anticipation.

Some families plan out an elaborate menu for Christmas Eve or Day while others re-use the same menu from the last 30 years. Some start baking and freezing cookies earlier in December while others

do cookie marathons once the days in December arrive at the 20's.


The idea is that hanging the proverbial carrot at the end of the stick creates that desire, the anticipation. See the graph above, from a

Christmas Company named Balsam Hill—I removed numbers and percentages—just to see the general actions of Americans.

You're reading this because that blend of preparation that the Church offers as well as what you traditionally do at home is important to you.

In a super-commercialized world, people are grasping for that Christmas Spirit earlier than ever. Maybe its grasping at nostalgia, or maybe its representative of people who don't have church as part of their prepara-

Pierogi making takes place on-and-off throughout the parish year, dependent on the holidays, help, and the schedule of fundraisers.


The Food Ministry group sponsored a pierogi-making event on Saturday, No-

Fundraisers:

- Trunk or Treat while not a fundraiser, we promoted this as a community outreach event we had about 9 parishioners decorate their trunks or pass out candy to 29 trunk or treaters. Great fun was had by all.
- A second invitation to join St. Mary's for mass was postponed to next year in deference to Josephine's 100th birthday celebration!
- The committee was asked to consider the purchase of two new Christmas trees for the altar. Consideration is being giv-
