Holy Trinity in Holy Mass

June often has the biggest shakeup of the church calendar- Last year was a better example than this; let me explain: in 2022 (and next in 2025) June begins still in the Easter Season...then we will have Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi, and Ordinary Time all take placefour very different feelings of the Church.

Trinity Sunday kinda comes-and-goes the quickest. In fact, the day after Trinity Sunday is this tiny, miniscule 3 day portion of Ordinary Time until Thursday's Solemnity of Corpus Christi. But, I wanted to give the Trinity its proverbial flowers today and write on the touch of the Trinity on the Mass.

My focus is on the Contemporary Rite of the Mass...but to also touch on the Traditional Rite a bit. To understand the Traditional Rite is to know its roots as the Tridentine Mass, which was the official form of the Mass in the Catholic Faith



from 1570-1962. In the Polish National Catholic Church, this was extended into the 1980's, when the Contemporary Rite began its formation.

The title is the giveaway, right? "Tridentine Mass" would make one think "Trinity"...but that is a long-mistaken belief. "Tridentine" is actually taken from the Latin word "Tridentinus", referring to the city of Tridentum in Italy...now known as Trent, where the council that approved this form of the Mass was held. However, the celebrant of Tridentine/Traditional Mass does make 33 signs of the cross, the pure mark of the Trinity, throughout the entirety of the Mass, so I guess it isn't that wrong!

Signs of the Cross aside, there are other

moments of the Mass that are directly Trinitarian, and, because we all have much of the Mass memorized (!), I wanted to look at those hidden and more overt instances.

The first is within the Gloria- while the first line is taken from Luke 2:14, the rest is St. Mary's P.N.C.C 5375 Broadview Road Parma, OH 44134

> theology- and it spells out the role of God in our life of worship, how the Son fits in, and just a small mention of the Spirit. Trinitarian, but focusing on the first two members of the Godhead.

> The next is the Nicene creed, overt in addressing "One God", and then spelling out the three members of the Trinity who are "One God:" The Father, who is Almighty; the Son, begotten by the Father, the Sprit's part in that, confluence of divinity and humanity; and the Holy Spirit, the Giver of Life.

> In the Offertory, we circle around the Trinity twice: we request God's blessing individually on the wine and bread, as human ingenuity have taken God's creations and formed them into what is to be sacrificed. The priest blesses the water, a sole creation of God with no human touch, with the desire to share the divinity of Christ, second

person of the Trinity. Then, we ask the Spirit's blessing on the totality of the Sacrifice, acknowledging his role as Advocate between Heaven and Earth- the desire to take this earthly thing and make it heavenly.

The next prayer is an overt Trinitarian prayer: after addressing each member of the Trinity uniquely, we now bundle them: "Receive this offering, most Holy Trinity, which we make in memory of the passion, resurrection and ascension of our Lord, Jesus Christ, and in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints. May they, whose memory we honor on earth, intercede for us in heaven."

This is one of two Trinity-directed prayers in the Forms of the Mass- did you ever notice that before? The next portion of prayer that holds the Trinity is the Canon, or Eucharistic Prayer of the Mass. The 1st Prayer is based on the Traditional Canon, an ancient Canon in its original form.

We address the first number of prayers to God the Father, with the first through Jesus Christ. We call upon the Father to fill our offering of bread and wine with the power of the Holy Spirit. This is called the epiclesis, "the calling of the Spirit", which is part of what makes Mass whole. Then, immediately after the epiclesis, "the shift" takes place. The priest becomes Alter Christus, "another Christ", with the prayers becoming directly of the Son during the Consecration. Following the Consecration, the emphasis returns to the Father, with the concluding doxology "Through Him, with Him and in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is Yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever" showing deference to each member of our beloved Holy Trinity.

In the Traditional Rite of the Mass, there is an extra prayer to the Holy Trinity that takes place in between the Dismissal and the final Blessing (in Contemporary Mass, the Blessing comes first, then the Dismissal). This is the second of the two Trinity-directed prayers within the Forms of the Mass. It is the final petition of the priest at Mass and it encapsulates all private and public intentions of the Mass. It reads: *"May the tribute of our worship be pleasing to You, most Holy Trinity. Grant that the sacrifice which I,*

though unworthy, have



offered in the sight of your Majesty, be acceptable to You. Through Your mercy, may it be effective for myself and all those for whom I have offered it. Through Christ, our Lord. Amen."

I should mention that each of the 3 major prayers of Mass (Opening, Prayer over Gifts, Post-Communion) always address the Trinity. Though the structure can shift (like how the prayers on Pentecost address the Spirit), they usually take the form of something like "Almighty Father...(great stuff happened during the gospel and at Mass)... We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever!"

The Trinity is a Mystery- how could 3 unique persons as One God not be? But may we gain further understanding and appreciation in looking at the Trinity in each celebration of Holy Mass.

Fr. Jason attends National Meeting

The National Liturgical Commission of the PNCC met from Monday, May 22– Wednesday, May 24 in the offices of the Prime Bishop of the Polish National Catholic Church; Scranton, PA.

The Commission meets twice a year, presenting work done over the last number of months for adaptation in the liturgical life of the Polish National Catholic Church. This includes information and documents that are created solely for the use of the clergy as well as those created for the use of the entirety of the church.

Fr. Jason presented a crossreferenced Calendar of Saints that was edited, updated and cross-checked from an existing calendar for use in the PNCC that included around 1100 unique saints. It was accepted after hours of work. The Commission meets again in late October.



Clergy Conference of the PNCC Western Diocese

The Annual Clergy Conference and Retreat of the PNCC Western Diocese took place May 15-17 at Joseph & Mary Retreat Center in Mundelein, IL.

The diocesan clergy have really grown to appreciate this retreat center (a former seminary), now having been here for a half-decade or so. Fr. Jim Ploskonka was the leader of the retreat portion of the time together, providing a guided outline of his first months in priesthood as well as a course in apologetics.

Fr. Jim's presentation was very wellreceived, inciting discussion, questions, and a desire for more in the future. The conference took place to discuss matters for the clergy of diocese, as well as to let the chief shepherd of the diocese, our Bishop, address anything that is of concern at present time or in the future.

Of course, much fellowship was shared as well, with a beautiful confluence of Polish snacks and Latino snacks to make sure not a single stomach went to bed rumbling!
