
YMSofR as well as the work of local parish YMSofR Branches.

Our Parish Organizations: Part 1- YMSofR Branch #29

Over the next few months of the newsletter, we will have a series explanations of each parish organization— who they are and what they do.

Branch #29 of the YMSofR (Young Men's Society of the Resurrection) was formed within the last 15 or so years. There once was an active men's club within the parish that fell out of practice.

The YMSofR was established by Bishop Francis Hodur in 1914 as a men's society for, amongst other things, the betterment and perfection of religious life.

It is a national organization, with branches across the United States at various Polish National Catholic parishes. Our organization pays dues for the men to belong to the national organization—about a dollar a month.

The local branches at each parish are a bit different in what they do for the parish and what they do at the parish.

Branch #29's president is Chuck Repede, a devoted Polish National Catholic who also serves at the Lord's Altar as an acolyte.

Chuck said that he is hopeful that more men of the parish would consider being part of the group in the months ahead. His hope as president is to lead the men in organizing some more social activities, as well as keeping up a formal meeting schedule.

One of the highlights of his tenure as president of Branch #29 was the planning and execution of the 8th and 9th Annual National YMSofR Golf Tournaments held respectively in 2022 and 2023 (see the article in this very newsletter!). He was thrilled how the men came together in such a supportive and

friendly way to plan something so involved and multi-layered! He also remarked in the past how it is humbling to hold an event where the proceeds go towards the support of children.

Branch #29 also participates in the National YMSofR Clothing Drive, which it has "won" multiple times through the years by how many clothing items were collected. Chuck has represented the branch on multiple occasions in his travels to the Bi-Ennial Convention of the YMSofR and a number of our men attend the annual Men's Spiritual Retreat in Waymart, PA.

Men of the church—if you are looking for a little more to do after Mass on Sunday or would like to connect with a great group of guys during the week, please consider joining the parish YMSofR!






"Splinter from the
